## **Project for Healing, Inc. Signs Letter of Intent to Merge with Beyond90, Inc.**

**Jacksonville, FL.** – Project for Healing, Inc. announced today that it has entered into a letter of intent to merge with Beyond90, Inc.

Mr. Barton Chelf, President of Beyond90, remarked, "This Letter of Intent marks a significant step in the expansion of refugee services within the Beyond90 organization focusing on an even broader holistic approach to assisting refugees on their journey toward self-sufficiency. Over the next 30 days, we will be focusing all of our efforts on meeting our obligations to close this transaction."

In the proposed merger between Beyond90 and Project for Healing, Beyond90 will remain the parent organization and legal entity. Project for Healing will transition to become a program of the Beyond90 organization.

Mrs. Christine Rothberg, Executive Director of Project for Healing, added, "This merge will allow Project for Healing to solely focus on our core service of providing excellent refugee and immigrant mental health services while receiving the administrative oversight and client support services of Beyond90. We feel this merger would be a win-win for both organizations."

Upon completion of the remaining due diligence, the Boards of the two nonprofit organizations will hold a merger vote. If affirmed, the merger will proceed. Although no specific timeline has been established, the organizations both expect a decision can be reached by February 1, 2021.
